Dear Sir/Madam,

With reference to your application seeking recognition of Distance Education Council for offering programmes through distance education mode, an Expert Committee was constituted comprising nominees of UGC, AICTE and DEC, which visited your Institution and submitted its recommendations. The recommendations of the Expert Committee were placed before the Distance Education Council in its 38th meeting. Based on the decision of the Distance Education Council, I have been directed to inform that your Institution has been accorded recognition for a period of three academic years w.e.f. academic year 2011-12 to academic year 2013-14 for offering following programmes through distance education mode:

A. The recognition to above programmes is subject to the compliance of the following by the University.

- The University/Institute shall offer only those programmes through distance mode which are on offer in the face-to-face/ regular mode and approved by the Distance Education Council as mentioned in this letter. The University will not offer any other programme

- through distance mode other than those approved by the Distance Education Council.
- ii) The University/Institute shall appoint at least one faculty per each programme exclusively in the Directorate of Distance Education, satisfying the basic eligibility requirements of UGC/AICTE to support the distance mode programmes.
 - iii) The University/Institute shall provide extensive and intensive training in ODL pedagogy to the faculty, coordinators, academic counsellors and administrative staff of the Directorate.
 - iv) The University shall initiate the process of revising the printed course material into SIM mode as per DEC norms by involving more experts on their advisory committees representing industries and academicians for preparing syllabus and developing, updating and revising the course material as per ODL pedagogy.
 - v) The University/Institute shall develop the criteria for establishing study centres, appointment of academic counsellors and support staff at the study centres.
 - vi) The University/Institute shall prepare manuals on evaluation and examination, conduct of practicals, project work and admission process etc.
 - vii) Use of ICT for the delivery of distance education programmes may be initiated.
 - viii) The existing University/Institute library should be strengthened by including books and journals related to the distance education.
 - ix) The University/Institute should constitute an advisory board for Distance Education with a representative of DEC as its member.

B. The University/Institution may note that:

1. The Institution will offer only such programmes through distance mode which are offered by the Institution through regular face-to-face mode and approved by the Distance Education Council as mentioned in this letter. The Institution will not offer any other programme through distance mode other than those approved by the Distance Education Council.
2. Programmes in the areas of Health, Nursing, Dentistry, Management, Computers and allied areas may be offered with the approval of the statutory councils/regulatory bodies, wherever required.
3. It will be the responsibility of the Institution to follow the norms prescribed by the regulatory bodies, and seek their approval, wherever required.
4. The nomenclature of the programmes should be strictly as prescribed by the UGC/AICTE and approved by the Distance Education Council.
5. The eligibility conditions and duration of programmes will be as per the DEC norms and for professional and technical programmes as per the norms laid down by the AICTE. No admission to MBA, PGDBM and MCA programmes can be done without ensuring that the student has secured a valid score in the entrance test examination for this purpose.
6. The Institution shall limit admission to maximum 60 seats per programme per Study Centre for Management, Computer & IT, and Allied Health Sciences programmes. For laboratory/Practical work, the institution can have a maximum of 30 students in a batch subject to maximum 60 students per Study Centre. The Study Centre be owned by the University and should be opened with the approval of EC/BOM of the University concerned.
7. The Institution should have at least one full time faculty member exclusively for coordinating each programme at the Headquarters.
8. The territorial jurisdiction for offering programmes through distance mode will be as per the decision taken in the 35th Meeting of the Distance Education Council. In its 35th meeting the Council noted that distance education and online education cannot have the Territorial Jurisdiction. In case of Central Universities and the State Universities, the Territorial Jurisdiction will be as per their Acts and Statutes for offering programmes through distance mode. The Territorial Jurisdiction in case of Deemed Universities will be as per UGC, which mandates the prior approval of the UGC for opening Centres / off Campus Centres outside the Headquarters. The Territorial Jurisdiction in case of Private Institutions (other than Universities) will be as decided by the Joint Committee, which has decided that the territorial jurisdiction for the institutions (both private as well as Govt funded) shall be the Headquarters, and in no case outside the State.
9. The territorial jurisdiction for offering programmes through distance mode by your institution shall be the head quarters of the University as per the notification of the UGC and as per DEC norms.
10. The Distance Education Council prohibits franchising of Study Centres. Thus, your Institution will not franchise any Study Centre in any part of the country or abroad.



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11. The Institution's management of the distance education programmes will be open for review and inspection from time to time by DEC to provide inputs for further improvement or as deemed necessary. The academic norms of the programmes shall be under monitoring and regulation by the concerned regulatory authorities.
12. For Management and Computer Science programmes, the Institution should also note that:
- The programme should have a mandatory internship of six months;
 - Institute/University concerned should seek accreditation from National Board of Accreditation as per prevailing rules;
 - Institute/University concerned should have concerned Department and the conventional universities should have on campus programme on offer;
 - Institute/University concerned should not have advertised for the programmes before receiving the approval letter;
 - Institute/University concerned should disclose, on line, in public domain the details of the student admitted, centre-wise, as per the format to be prescribed by AICTE;
 - Institute/University concerned should ensure delivery of the course material on-line with in one year of the date of approval.

It may be noted that before launching the programme the Institution should submit an affidavit within 30 days from date of issue of this letter that it agrees to and will abide by all terms and conditions contained in this letter. In case, the DEC does not receive the affidavit within 30 days from date of issue of this letter, the approval accorded to your Institution will be considered as withdrawn. Further, if it is found that the Institution is flouting any norms, then the recognition accorded to your Institution will be withdrawn without any notice.

Note: The Institute may think of increase the number of programmes keeping in view the strength of the organisation. The Institute may explore the possibility having NGOs/Community Colleges as nodal agencies to organise classes, information centres of the institute. The Institute should introduce flexibility to facilitate the students movement from regular to distance education and vice-versa; and the institute may also think of offering programmes in Hindi medium to increase the outreach of the programmes, especially in Hindi spoken regions.

Sir/Madam,

The University Grants Commission had accorded recognition to your University/Institution for offering programmes through distance mode upto the current academic session i.e. 2014-15. The matter regarding continuation of recognition to universities/institutions for the academic session 2015-16 was considered by Commission in its 505th Meeting held on 22.12.2014. It was decided in the said meeting that status quo may be maintained.

2. In the meantime, it has come to the notice that some of the universities/institutions are still violating the norms and guidelines prescribed for offering programmes through ODL mode. Therefore, to safeguard the interest of stakeholders, it has been decided that submission of affidavit assuring strict abiding of all the terms and conditions of the UGC shall be a pre-condition for continuation of recognition for the academic session 2015-16.

3. It is therefore requested that a (i) copy of affidavit furnished earlier by the university/institution for the recognition granted during 2014-15, (ii) Letter of Intent and (iii) a fresh Affidavit in the prescribed format (copy enclosed) may be submitted to UGC immediately.

4. The UGC will consider to convey the approval for the recognition for 2015-16 on receipt of above documents.

Every year the request letter along with the proposal of distance mode course is being submitted to the UGC for approval. Once the approval is received the MOM is being signed by the Director & Sr. Professor and the notarized copy of the affidavit is submitted to the UGC on prescribed UGC format.

10. Name and other details of course Coordinator at HQ

Prof. B. Paswan, Coordinator of Department of Extra Mural Studies and Distance Education. Only one Master's course is being conducted by IIPS.

11. Complete Prospect/brochure covering all aspects of ODL Program

Master of Population Studies - MPS (Through Distance Education)

In view of the growing demand for intensive and need-based training in the field of population data analysis and inter-relationship between Population and Development, the Institute has started a Distance Education Programme leading to Master's Degree in Population Studies in 1994.

Eligibility criteria for admission: Admission to this course is open to all those with a Master's degree from any recognized University in any of the Social Science subjects including Mathematics, Statistics, Health & allied subjects. Preference will be given to candidates having experience in population, Health and /or in allied areas.

Number of seats: There are **150** seats available for admission to this course. However, the Institute reserves the right to decide the number of students to be enrolled in each academic session.

Selection criteria: Selection of candidates for the course will be done by a selection committee duly constituted by the Director of the Institute.

Reservation: Reservation for SC/ST/OBC/PH candidates will be considered as per the Government of India norms.

Duration of course: This course can be completed in a minimum period of two years, as well within a maximum period of four years. In case if candidate is not able to complete the course in a given time period, he/she can avail one year extension after paying 50% of the course fee. Maximum 2 times continuous extension will be given. If the candidate fails in completing all the formalities even after availing two successive extensions, he/she will not be eligible for degree and his/her registration will automatically stand cancelled without any intimation.

Sending of self instruction course materials to the students by post: The self-instructional course materials are sent to the students in three lots by post/courier services. The materials include instructions for self study and self assessment exercises.

1. **Contact programmes in the Institute:** Every year contact programme of two weeks duration is organised in the Institute in the month of June/July. During the contact programme a thorough feedback on the course material sent throughout the year is given in addition to the laboratory exercises related to technical papers, computer applications and preparation of term paper/dissertation.
2. **Evaluation & Examinations:** Examination will be held twice in a year (June/July and December) at the Institute. The written examination is followed by preparation of a Term paper and Viva-Voce examination. The evaluation is done by direct grading system. In order to qualify for the degree, a student is required to obtain a total of 44 credits (written examination and assignments: 36 credits, term paper: 4 credits, viva-voce: 4 credits). However, total number of credits may increase after revision of entire course curriculum.
